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## PREFACE

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The outstanding problem which concerns every historian of Byzantine art is that of the persistency of the Hellenistic tradition on the one hand and of the influence of Near Eastern, non-Greek art in Christian painting on the other. The classical tendency in Byzantine art is usually described as a survival of late Hellenism ; the oriental influence is regarded as being due to the art of Early Christian Syria, Armenia and Egypt. But whereas the architecture of Eastern Christianity has been thoroughly studied, research on the subject of illumination of manuscripts written in the national languages of the Eastern Churches outside Europe has generally been confined to very few examples ; many of them, and very important ones, have never been published or even taken into consideration by scholars working in this field. Moreover, the relative historical position of these Eastern Christian manuscripts is by no means so clear as many students have been inclined to assume. These miniatures are certainly not pure representations of non-Greek art, but are themselves the outcome of a complicated process of interpenetration of oriental and Hellenistic tendencies ; the problem of the power of the Hellenistic tradition appears for each of these groups in a new and different light. These Eastern Christian miniatures ought to be adduced as a source of Byzantine art only after the complicated process of evolution within the religious art of the Eastern Churches has been made sufficiently clear. This bibliographical study aims at facilitating research of this kind by making the preserved material more easily accessible to students of East Christian art.

As the chief interest of these groups of miniatures consists in their possible influence on the art of the Byzantine Empire, or the possible influence of Byzantine art on them, only manuscripts up to the fifteenth century have been listed in the following pages. This somewhat arbitrary limitation is perhaps justified by the fact that after the fifteenth century the main stream of Byzantine art ceased, and illustrated Eastern Christian manuscripts themselves then became rarer and artistically less interesting. This date marks, moreover, a decisive break in the tradition. In Ethiopian painting, this break was caused by the influence and diffusion of European art ; in Georgian painting, the new influence was that of Islamic Persia.

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Only in Armenian book-illustration is the medieval tradition seen to survive up to the eighteenth century.

The present hand list is intended primarily as an index and bibliography to the existing literature, which it is difficult to survey. No comprehensive history of the arts of oriental Christianity has yet been written ; and many bibliographical references are found scattered in manuscript catalogues, philological, liturgical, and palæographical publications, and the like. Though we have aimed at making as complete a collection as possible of these references, we are well aware that our list is far from being a catalogue of all the illuminated Eastern Christian manuscripts still existing in Europe and in the East. As many library catalogues, especially the older ones, do not mention whether illustrations are contained in the manuscripts described, it would have been necessary to examine one by one every Eastern manuscript in every library.<sup>1</sup> Instead, we have limited ourselves to collecting the bibliographical references in a synoptical way for the use of students of art history. Illuminations which fall below a certain artistic standard have been omitted from this list<sup>2</sup>.

As far as library catalogues and reproductions of miniatures are concerned, we have tried to bring together all the references accessible to us. The bibliography of articles and papers has been limited to such references as contain relevant information.

<sup>2</sup> In the monumental publication of Stassoff for instance, a number of ornaments are reproduced which are of no artistic interest. Such manuscripts have not been listed ; nor have numerous Coptic manuscripts such as are found in every European library. Nearly every Coptic manuscript contains some crude and simple ornaments ; and the number of manuscripts preserved is particularly abundant. Of this material we have decided to include a selection only, mentioning in the first place those manuscripts which are easily accessible and, as far as possible, all references of reproductions.

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Books and articles in which illuminated manuscripts already known from other references are mentioned without any additional details of interest have been intentionally omitted<sup>3</sup>. Any comment on the artistic merits or the stylistic position of miniatures has been avoided.

The manuscripts have been arranged according to the language in which they are written. Bilingual manuscripts of the Coptic Church containing an Arabic translation have been listed under Coptic.

The chapters dealing with the Armenian and Georgian manuscripts need a few words of explanation and apology. At first, it was intended to give a list of all known illuminated manuscripts up to A.D. 1500, just as in the other parts of the book. But the difficulties proved insuperable. For an appallingly great number of items the necessary information was incomplete or needed checking up on the spot. When war broke out, travelling and extensive correspondence with scholars abroad became impossible.

Thus, we decided to limit ourselves to an index of those Armenian and Georgian manuscripts of which reproductions are published. Even this was possible only on a reduced scale. A number of relevant publications are not available in the libraries accessible to us. It is especially regrettable that practically all books and articles in the Armenian language belong to this category. In many cases, however, the lack of bibliographical completeness is perhaps not so detrimental as it may appear at first sight. Quotations referring to publications not to be found even in world-famous libraries are of little help. An Armenian periodical published at Tiflis, for instance, will be just as inaccessible to the majority of art students as it was to us. Thus, the Armenian and Georgian section of the present list should be considered as a catalogue of those manuscripts of which reproductions are easily available. As an exception, a few unpublished miniatures

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have been included ; but this applies only to manuscripts on which we were able to take copious notes, or on which detailed information was kindly supplied by the custodians of the manuscripts.

The completion of our work would have been impossible without the kind help, generously given, of a large number of libraries, museums, learned institutions and individual scholars. We wish to thank especially the following scholars who supplied us with relevant information : Dr. R. Ettinghausen, Dr. E. Gombrich, Father G. de Jerphanion S.J., Professor Paul Kahle, Father A. van Lantschoot, Mr. J. Leveen, Father August Merk S.J., Professor Ugo Monneret de Villard, Mr. C. Moss, Father R. Mouterde S.J., Monsieur Henri Munier, Miss S. Der Nersessian, Dr. Carl Nordenfalk, Monsieur Henri Stern, Abbé De Vis, Dr. W. F. Volbach. Mr. G. Aharon supplied us with a complete bibliography of the important Ethiopic manuscript in his possession. Biblioteca Nazionale, Naples ; the Metropolitan Museum and the Pierpont Morgan Library, New York ; and the R. Wood, of the Chester Beatty Library, London, informed us about the change of ownership of manuscript No. 445 of this list. We are particularly grateful to Mr. Togo Mina, Deputy Director of the Coptic Museum, Cairo, and Abd el Masih Effendi, its learned librarian, who were indefatigable in helping us to consult the great number of Coptic manuscripts in that Museum and kindly allowed us to make use of the proofs of M. Simaika Pasha's unpublished great catalogue. They even put at our disposal their hand-written notes on Coptic manuscripts in Egyptian churches and monasteries ; these notes have been our only source for all those Coptic manuscripts still preserved in Egypt which have been listed without reference to printed bibliographical items. 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## CHRONOLOGICAL INDEX

In the first part of this index all those manuscripts are listed whose date of origin is known through a scribe's or illuminator's colophon. It should be remembered that various methods of reckoning time were in use in the East, and that the Christian New Year did not coincide with the New Year of any Eastern reckoning, so that the years according to the Eastern and the Christian mode of reckoning overlapped. Thus, each year of these Eastern eras corresponds to consecutive parts of two Christian years. When Eastern years had to be converted into years of the Christian era, we have tried to give both years to which the year of the Eastern era would correspond. In those instances where only one year is given, the possibility remains that in fact the manuscript in question originated one year earlier or later. When a colophon has been differently read by different scholars, we have listed the manuscript under both dates.

The second part of the index contains all those manuscripts which can be dated on palaeographical or stylistic evidence only. Here again we have strictly adhered to the attributions found in the current literature, quoting as a rule the results of the most recent or most specialized research. Manuscripts which have been attributed by scholars to a period extending over several centuries have been listed under each century separately.

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
